

Honesty

> **Prayers** sing “E Te Atua” & “O God! Educate these children...”

> **Quote** – read, explain and memorise it.

Brother and Sister break Mama Bear's favorite lamp and learn the importance of telling the truth rather than covering up.

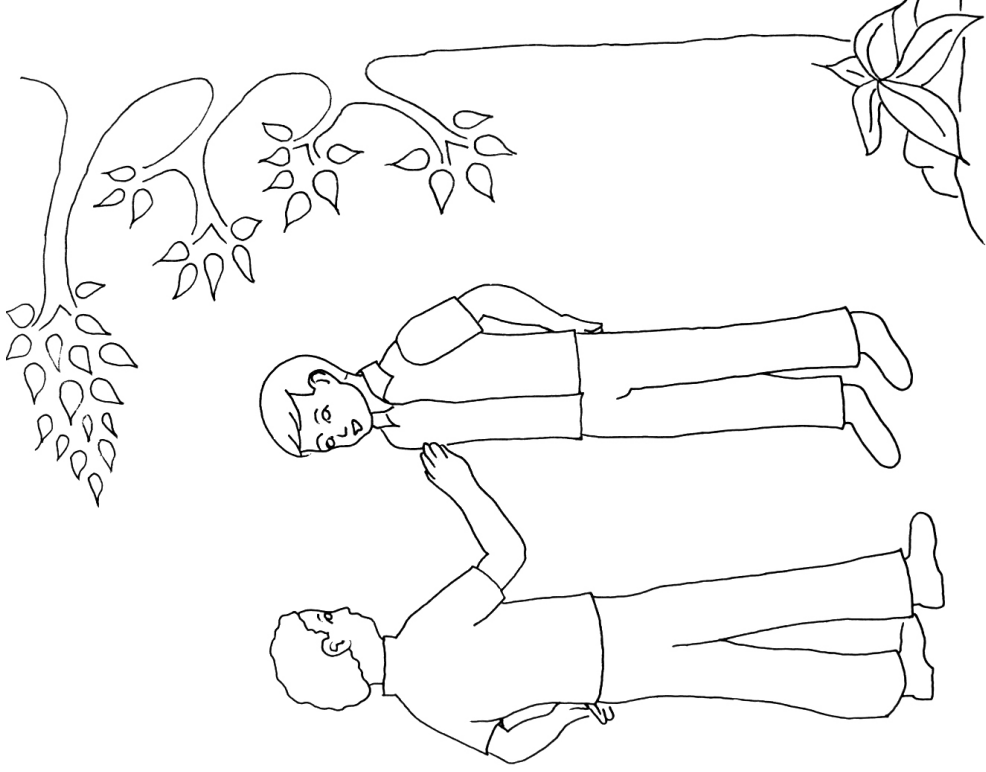
Role Play: *Have the students role play or make a skit about having to admit a big mistake and making amends. Talk about the courage it takes to be honest and to set things right.*

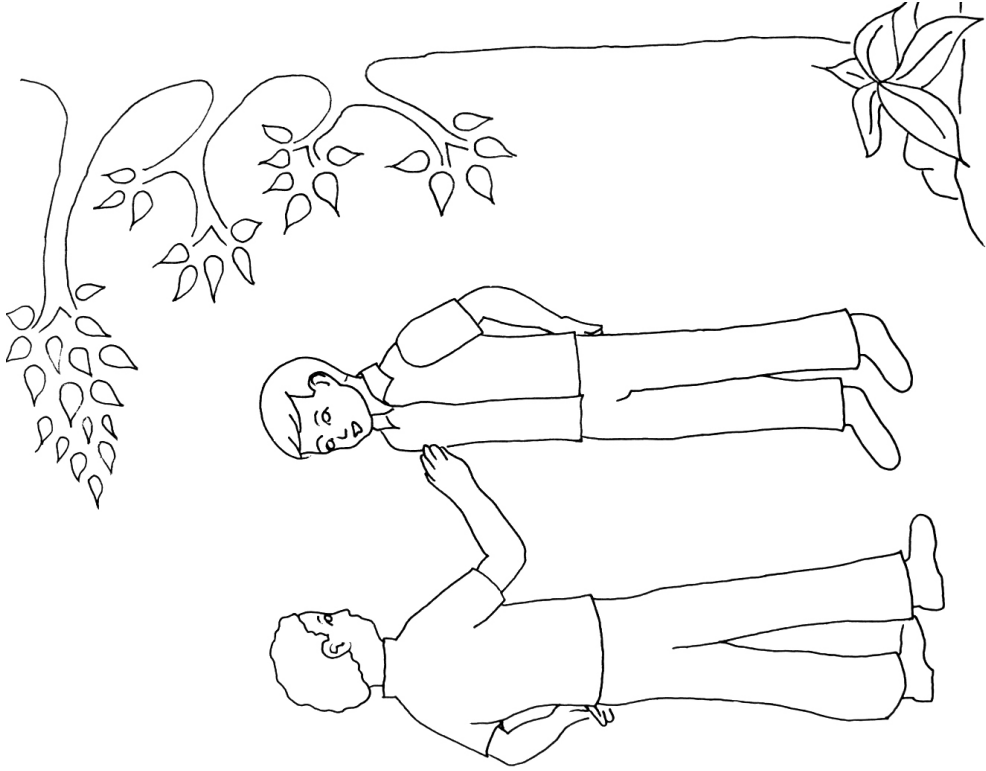
