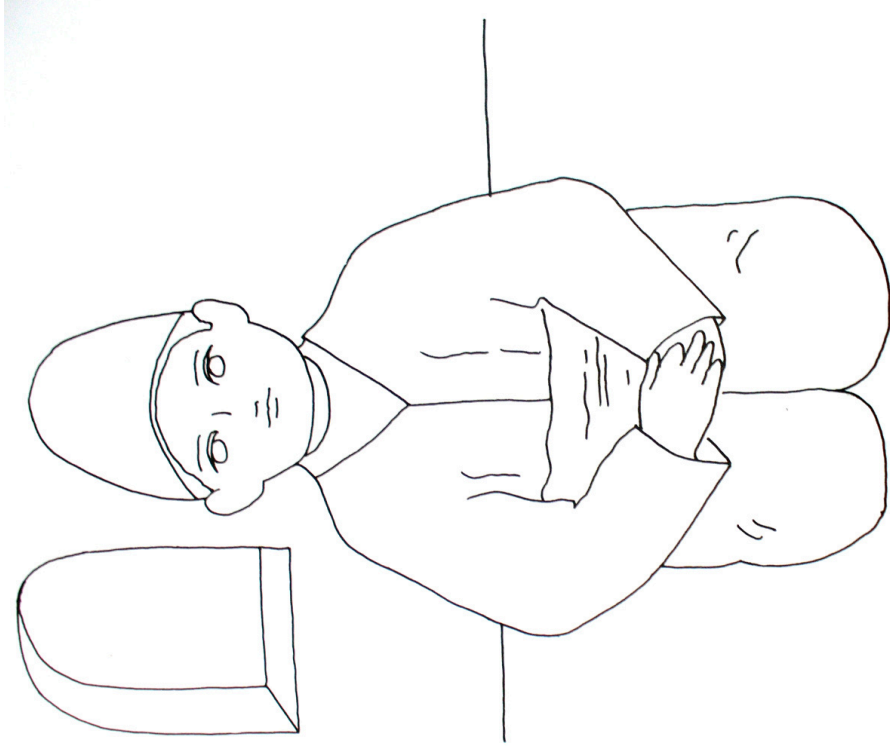

> **Game** "The Blind Man"

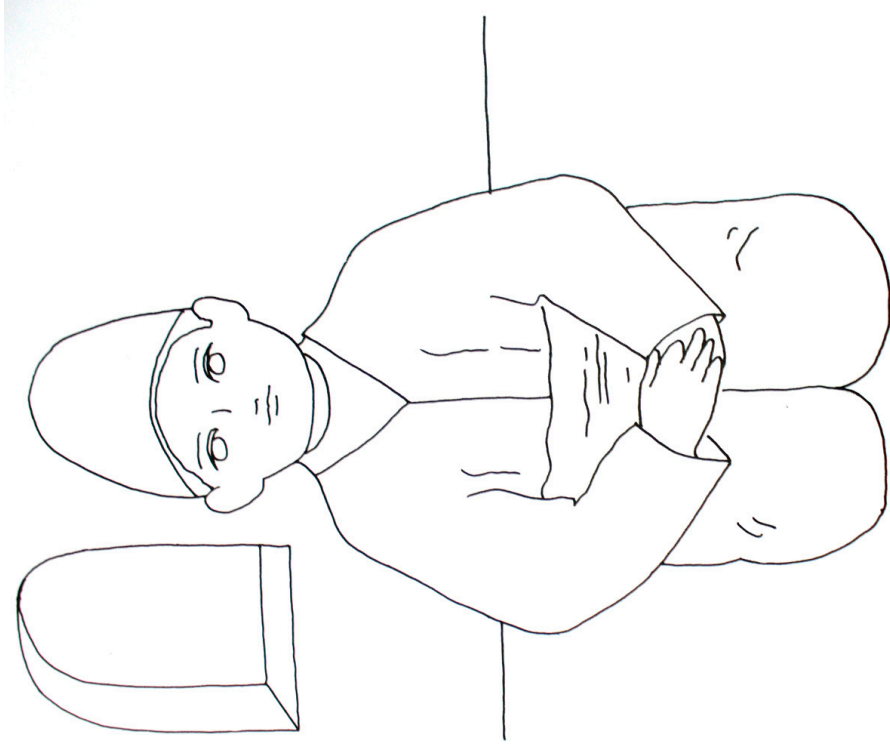
One child is blindfolded. Another acts as his guide and leads him around, being careful that nothing happens to him.
